When the noun is singular the verb has the letter S at the end. When the noun is plural the verb does not have an S. This is called **subject-verb agreement.** Did you notice that a singular verb has an added -S but a singular noun does not?

Some verbs are irregular. The verb TO BE is one of them. This verb includes words like *am, are* and *is* or *was* and *were*. The verbs *is* and *was* are to be used with a singular noun and *are* and *were* should be used with plural nouns.

Subject Verb Agreement for Tense

There are two things we need to look at for subject verb agreement. The first one is number (this is what we practiced in the sentences above). The second one is tense. If one verb in a sentence is in the present tense, all verbs in the sentence must be in present tense. The same is true for past tense. If one verb in a sentence is in past tense, all verbs in that sentence must be in past tense.
